Author Will Hillenbrand and Kite Day

Popular PA author/illustrator Will Hillenbrand delighted hundreds of children, parents, and teachers during his visit to IVPL on Wednesday, April 13. His visit, part of PA's "One Book/Every Young Child," included IVPL as one stop on a 5-week-long tour around the state.

Over 220 preschoolers, plus parents and teachers, came to see Mr. Hillenbrand tell his story about how he conceived of the plots and drew the illustrations for the Bear and Mole stories. Every young child received his/her own copy of the paperback to take home. Then, each made an easy kite with colored paper, string, and a bright orange tail, and everyone went outside to fly their kites in the breezy, springtime sun. What a day!

Dozens of programs for preschoolers, school-age kids, and teens are in the works. Prizes are given for time spent reading (or being read to).

New Leadership at the Library

Margie Stern will be taking over as director of the library, beginning June 1, with the retirement of Linda Beck. Margie has been a district consultant for youth library services at the Delaware County Library System for over 20 years. She is the past president of the PA Library Association. In accepting the position offered her by the Board of Trustees, she commented how much she is looking forward to leading a big, busy library with innovative programs and a true community spirit.

Linda Beck started at IVPL in 1988 as the children's librarian and was appointed director in 1996. Since then, several additions have been built on to the library (including the Reading Room, Storyhour Room, and 2010 nonfiction addition), and staff and hours were expanded to give service seven days a week. IVPL is one of the busiest libraries in Montgomery County. Linda looks forward to a retirement filled with good things to read.

Attachment 1: Window-Tinting

Proposal 1: from Tint-Pro (Collegeville)

Uses 3MSun Control Window Film Night vision 35, 12-year warranty

Tinting 18 panes of glass \$2395 Tinting all windows \$7245

(deduct \$725 if all areas are completed at once = \$6520)

Proposal 2: from Alderfer Glass (Telford):

Uses Madico DG35 or DG 45, 15-year warranty

Tinting 16 panes of glass \$1995 Tinting all windows \$5985

Attachment 2: Water Technology

Proposal to install a water purifier for fresh cool drinking water and hot water.

From 3i Pure Water Technology in Allentown \$59/month on a 60-month program

Attachment 3: Museum Passes

IVPL would purchase a membership to a museum and lend the passes to patrons. Usual terms (notes from other area libraries):

Loan period 3-7 days

Late fees \$1-\$5 per day

Limit one museum pass per family at a time

Lost fee is the full cost of museum pass

Patrons cannot renew passes, nor reserve via catalog.
