Mini-Golf at the Library - 320 People!

How to celebrate the long Valentines/Presidents' Weekend when you don't go away (and it's really cold outside)? Try a round or two of mini-golf right in the library, on Saturday, February 13. Over 300 kids and their parents enjoyed a relaxing day of golf, away from the snow and chilly temperatures, right in the library. All 18 holes were decorated differently, and prizes were awarded for holes-in-one, smallest score, largest score, and more.

Several years ago, the Penn Valley Church built a mini-golf course for IVPL, which has been used for fundraisers and also for just-plain-fun events over the years. The course, which has never been laid out the same way twice, meanders through the library and offers participants of all ages a lot of fun on a chilly winter Saturday.

Who's coming to the library?

Our Strategic Planning Committee, in forming a vision statement with goals for the future, was recently surprised to learn a number of interesting community connections:

- Residents and staff from Peaceful Living, Indian Creek Foundation, and other group homes come to IVPL once a week or more to read, enjoy crafts, see neighbors, and view films.
- Knitters, crocheters, gamers, chess players, and more meet at the library once a week to knit, crochet, compete, and enjoy being with others.
- Congressman Fitzpatrick's staff meets with constituents at the library every Saturday, 10 am to 1 pm, to help with constituent concerns.

- ESL students and ESL families regularly visit the library on their own or with Indian Valley Opportunity Center.
- Police officers! Our Badges and Books storyhours on Wednesday evenings feature police officers reading to children once/month.
 On other Wednesdays, families hear stories read by a librarian.
- People who don't have computers at home rely on IVPL's computers, printers, and scanners to complete job applications, find social-security benefits, check bank accounts, and remain in touch with others through email.
- Homeschoolers from all over Bucks and Montgomery Counties regularly meet at the library for craft workshops, informational classes, and socializing.
- Dogs! Our "Ruff Ruff and Read" Saturdays (once a month) allow children to sit with a friendly dog and practice reading with them.
 It allows reticent children to feel free to make mistakes and try again – and make a new furry friend.

"Story of Bucks County" Author Program

Again this year, volunteers from the United Way and AARP are here at the library to help area residents fill out tax returns. Appointments are made by phone or at the Front Desk. Every year, hundreds of area residents receive free, informative tax help from well-trained and knowledgeable volunteers. We are happy to provide free space for this to happen here at the library.

Did you know?

Twenty years ago (February 1996) IVPL was beginning its year-long process of automating the library. All books were barcoded into the new computer system, and the printing of catalog cards was phased out.
