#### Author Will Hillenbrand at IVPL

If preschoolers could talk about favorite books, and favorite authors, chances are Will Hillenbrand would be in their Top Ten. Over many years, this Pennsylvania author/illustrator has written dozens of picture books. His 2012 work, <u>Kite Day: a Bear and Mole Story</u>, has been chosen for the 2016 "PA One Book" award, and he will be visiting libraries across the state all year.

Which brings him to Indian Valley – on Wednesday, April 13, at 10 am. Nursery schools and daycare centers are welcome to come, as are all members of the public. Books can be signed on this day. Funds from the Irv Rubin Director's Discretionary fund are being used to give each child a paperback book to take home.

IVPL is offering a fascinating array of interesting programs this spring – all free-of-charge and open to the public:

- Civil War Re-enactors Event
  - Saturday, April 2, 12-3 pm. An opportunity to meet local re-enactors from the PA 71st. Basic drills, displays of period costumes and items, and more.
- From Ghetto to World Prominence: Major Turning Points in Modern Jewish History.

Sundays, April 17 and 24, May 1 and 8, 2 pm. Led by Dr. Tom Kolsky of the Montgomery County Community College. Focuses on the major personalities, events, and forces that shaped Jewish history in the context of world history.

## World of .... Creatures!

Many thanks to the students of DelVal University in Doylestown for bringing a large array of animals (reptiles, amphibians) and insects to the library in early March. Children and parents who came to this program could touch and talk to all these creatures. DelVal students were able to talk one-on-one about the animals they brought. And, at the end of the evening, all the animals made their way back to DelVal safely. Not a single one was left in the library stacks.

This wonderful partnership between IVPL and DelVal began several Septembers ago for the first "Wild About Wildlife" day at IVPL. Since then, DelVal students have brought their creatures over here several times.

#### ...And for Children

They're usually so quiet, the rest of the library doesn't hear a thing. But the groups of preschoolers that come to IVPL for storyhours (eight or ten storyhours every week) are anything but quiet once the storyhour begins. Songs, fingergames, sometimes the parachute, and stories are an integral part of every storyhour.

New this season: Junior Engineers once a month after school (for schoolage children) and Block Party for preschoolers.
