Kids will take part in "On Your Mark, Get Set, Read!" Registration begins June 1 and lasts throughout the summer. Kids will keep track of the minutes they read; there are programs and workshops and events throughout the summer, daytime and evenings. Kick-off begins Saturday, June 18.

Museum passes

IVPL will offer free museum passes for families to places such as Drexel's Academy of Natural Sciences, the Elmwood Park Zoo, the Pearl S. Buck House, and six more. Most passes cover 2 adults and several children. The passes can be borrowed for four days, starting June 1.

Native Voices Exhibit

Thanks to the U.S. National Library of Medicine, IVPL will have a traveling interactive iPad exhibition about our native people's concepts of health and illness. On display May 26-July 5.

To kick off the exhibit, Lehigh University professor Jean Soderlund will discuss her book <u>Lenape Country: Delaware Valley</u> Society Before William Penn on Saturday, May 28, 2 pm.

Kids can attend a program on woodland life skills, presented by the Museum of Indian Culture, on Saturday, June 11, 11 am.

Looking at the Numbers for April:

People coming to the library:

21,495 people came to IVPL in April (average 716 people every day)

Books and materials checked out:

30,429 books and A-V items were checked out in April (6% more than Apr 2015)
Includes 12,857 for kids (up 6.7%)
984 for young adults, and
16,309 for adults (up 4.6%)

Programs/workshops/classes for kids and adults:

45 storyhours and programs for kids For 810 children and 489 adults 60 classes and programs for adults Involving 584 people

Internet and word processors:

Computers were used 3269 times in April.

Library card sign-ups and usage:

(88% of total pop. of 4680)

TOTAL borrowers from the 5 municipalities: 27,117 TOTAL borrowers from other areas: 11,064

1563 questions were asked and answered.
